List for Rising 4th - 8th Graders - 2016

Grade 3 into 4

A MINIMUM of five books is required. Students have to take an "Accelerated Reader" test for each of the five books.

Grade 4 into 5

A MINIMUM of eight books is required. Book choices should be of an appropriate level.

Students need to turn in a typed list of all books they read over the summer on the first day of school.

Grade 5 into 6

- A. Required The One and Only Ivan ~ Katherine Applegate
- B. Plus One of these: Mrs. Frisby and the Rats of NIMH ~ Robert O'Brien
- Weedflower ~ Cynthia Kadohata

*Students must select at least **three additional books** of their own choice to complete their summer reading requirement.

Grade 6 into 7

- A. Required for all: Fever 1793 - Laurie Halse Anderson
- B. Additional books (750 pages minimum), one of which MUST be NONFICTION

Grade 7 into 8

- A. Required for all: a. The Princess Bride - William Goldman
- b. Annie, Between the States - L. M. Elliott
- B. Additional books (400 pages minimum) of your own choice

Summer Math - Grades 1 - 8

Just as it is important for children to continue reading during the summer, it is also important for them to continue practicing mathematics. Please refer to this list for some games, puzzles, and other challenges that we hope your children will find interesting and fun. 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Rising 1st & 2nd:
