It's hard to believe that it's the third week of Kindergarten. The class is settling in beautifully, and they are feeling more comfortable with what is expected of them as Kindergarteners.

- In reading workshop this week, we have continued to explore folktales and fables. We are comparing and contrasting stories, characters and settings. We've discussed the feelings that the characters might have as well as the lessons that the stories are teaching.
- Our mentors came again this week and helped us to draw, color and paint our very unique apple trees. Both the mentees and the mentors had a wonderful time. Cate and I are seeing some sweet friendships beginning.
- During math workshop, we have been learning the days of the week, counting our classmates and the members of our families, as well as using some of our new attribute and sorting skills to sort each other (e.g. I call all the children with shorts up front, and the class has to guess the "rule" or attribute that they have in common).
- In Handwriting, we have been working on numeral writing and learning that all numbers and letters are made up of four basic elements (little line, big line, little curve, big curve). We used these to make "Mat Man".
